Mr. Young leads the legal functions for EG&G and for Lear Siegler Services. Mr. Young has 18 years of experience practicing law for both the Federal Government and the private sector in Virginia, Maryland and Washington, D.C. He started his career as a sole practitioner in the areas of personal injury, creditor rights and criminal law.

Mr. Young worked at the General Services Administration from 1984 - 1992. He served as a procurement counsel for the Federal Supply Service, where he provided advice on procurement statutes, regulations and FSS Multiple Award Schedules. Mr. Young also provided advice to information technology clients, and drafted contract clauses and regulations. At GSA Mr. Young was in charge of litigating bid protests at the General Accounting Office involving the procurement of personal property. He also litigated bid protests and contract disputes before the GSA Board of Contract Appeals.

After leaving GSA, Mr. Young joined DynCorp where he worked as Corporate Counsel from 1993 -1999. In this role Mr. Young focused on Government contract procurement matters, contract performance issues, teaming and joint venture agreements, information technology and international contracting issues. Mr. Young continued to litigate cases before GAO, GSBCA, and other administrative forums. He also directed outside counsel in litigation in various Federal and State Courts.

Mr. Young earned his BA from the University of Rochester in 1978. In 1982 Mr. Young earned his Juris Doctorate degree from the National Law Center, George Washington University.
